It has been an incredibly busy time for the Foundation, which is both the good news and the bad news! The good news is that we have been pulling and taking in injured and homeless dogs on a level we don't normally do, as the need is so great. The bad news is that it is very expensive!!!!! We need your help! In the past few months we have taken in three dogs that had been hit by cars with multiple broken bones and other injuries, a dog that was paralyzed whose owner couldn't care for her anymore, a young dog with severe arthritis whose owner (wait for it) "didn't like him" and a puppy with severely deformed front legs. We have another paralyzed one coming in, and three on the wait list who need surgery and amputations for car accident injuries. In other words we are up to our eyeballs in injured, expensive dogs!!! The great news is that we love all of them and they are all on the road to recovery. We don't often ask for help (ok, well, basically never) but right now we could really use some support! We love, love what we do and as I type, two of those puppies have just found their forever homes. We truly could not do this without you, our village. We first saw Stary's post at 1am and couldn't sleep knowing she'd be killed by 3pm that


day. So the Animal Rescue Mission rescued her and reached out to us.

caused by something called Puppy Carpal Laxity syndrome which was compounded by being confined in a crate that was too small, preventing her from standing up and forcing her legs to splay and bow out. But look at her now!

In terms of her personality she just adores every rescue dog we have here at Two Hands Four Paws and is the definition of a social butterfly. She loves everyone and we love her right back. As all other puppies, he'll need some help with training and learning the routine of home-life, but he is well up for the challenge.

We first heard about Nube, (translated to Cloud in Spanish... perfect right?) when she was left at a vet hospital after becoming acutely paralyzed in her hind limbs. Nube, 4 years old, remains super joyful and loves every single person (and pup) she meets. Nube cannot walk, but she comes with a wheelchair and needs her bladder expressed but is very easy to do. She needs a home that champions her special needs. Her sweetness shines, she loves to be held and says she is hoping for a new family that will give her lots of love and kindness.
